World Central Kitchen to Receive Ruth Brinker Visionary Award at Project Open Hand's 32nd Annual Gala

SAN FRANCISCO (November 11, 2024) – Project Open Hand's annual Hand to Hand gala on Friday, November 22 will capture the attention of local community members as it presents its highest honor, the Ruth Brinker Visionary Award, to World Central Kitchen at the event.

Ruth Brinker, a pioneer of HIV care in San Francisco's community, would go on to become a legend in the city where she founded Project Open Hand, often receiving some of the loudest cheers at San Francisco's Pride March.

Today, Project Open Hand is a staple of the Bay Area food community, serving nearly a million medically tailored meals each year to people living with severe, complex, or chronic illnesses like HIV/AIDS, cancer, and heart disease.

Reserved for exemplary community members who embody Project Open Hand's founder in their selfless dedication and generosity, World Central Kitchen will be presented with the Ruth Brinker Visionary Award at the gala.

World Central Kitchen, the front-line organization that provides food relief to communities impacted by natural disasters and humanitarian crises, has provided fresh, nutritious meals to those impacted by them. The organization, founded by celebrity chef José Andrés in 2010, has served countless communities globally, and provided relief this year alone to people in Spain, North Carolina, Gaza, and more.

According to the World Central Kitchen CEO, Erin Gore, "World Central Kitchen is honored to receive this award and help celebrate Project Open Hand's achievements toward a healthier California. We are kindred organizations that both believe in the power of food-no matter where you are, it is a reminder that you are not alone, someone is thinking about you, and someone cares."
